

Considered by many to be the world's authority on shamanism, Michael Harner introduces participants to core

shamanism - the universal and near-universal basic methods of the shaman to enter non-ordinary reality for problem solving, well-being and healing.

During this experiential workshop, particular emphasis is on the classic shamanic journey, one of the most remarkable visionary methods used by humankind to explore the hidden universe. Participants are initiated into shamanic journeying, aided by drumming and movement techniques to experience the shamanic state of consciousness and awaken dormant spiritual abilities.

Michael Harner is an anthropologist who has practiced shamanism and shamanic healing since 1961 and has pioneered their return to contemporary life. President of the Foundation of Shamanic Studies, he has been a professor at Columbia, Yale and and chair of the Anthropology Department of the Graduate Faculty at the New School of Social Research. His books include *The Way of the Shaman, Hallucinogens and Shamanism*, and *The Jivaro*.
