


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MAP of SANTA FE





Nambe Lake Trail

Approximately 7 mile round trip trail, accessible from the Ski Santa Fe parking area, via the Winsor Trail.

Also referred to as Chaco Canyon, it is a National Historical Park hosting the densest and most exceptional concentration of pueblos in the Southwest. The park preserves one of the United States; most important pre-Columbian cultural and historical areas, with an astounding collection of ancient ruins.




Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta


